Excellence in academics:-

We also focus on 21st-century skills, rather than just bookish knowledge.

We are proud to announce that the first batch of Class X students (2022-23) who appeared in the CBSE Board Exams achieved 100% results with an aggregate of 80 plus. Seven students have scored 90 and above in various subjects, with the highest score of 97 in English.

We have also started XI class with stream options such as M.P.C, Bi. P.C, and M.Bi.P.C with Informatics Practices from this academic year 2023-24.

Sports

At DAV, we strongly believe that physical fitness is an essential aspect of education. Therefore, we provide excellent facilities for sports and games along with academic studies. Our sports facilities include Volleyball, Hockey, Kho Kho, Target Ball, Badminton, Athletics, and more. We also have indoor sports facilities like Chess, Carrom, Table Tennis, and Wrestling.

KITSCON Math Lab is a place rich with manipulative materials, with which students have ready access to handle and perform mathematical experiments, play mathematical games, solve mathematical puzzles and become involved in activities related to mathematics. KITSCON MATH LAB INSTRUMENTS are proven manipulative (hands-on) materials.
- b) Hobby Clubs As stated earlier, hobby clubs are an add-on this year.
- c) Ground Levelling works, 200m running Track, Construction of permanent Dias, procurement of Foot Ball Poles, Badminton Poles, Hand Ball Poles, Provision of Long Jump pit etc.,
- d) **The Hindu in School:-**The Hindu-in-school -is a student edition newspaper, which is published from Monday to Friday every week. This is a curated newspaper exclusively for students, covering topics ranging from Science & Technology, G.K, English, Health, Environment, Experiments, etc. in addition to these features there is space for publishing students' achievements, activities /happenings at school. This newspaper also helps in improving cognitive thinking, promotes reading, and boosts the confidence of students.
- e) Hockey Classes for the students is an added advantage for the students at DAV IITH and now we have a good Hockey Team ready to represent the School in U14 & U17 categories at State and National level.
