Key Points

1. Nursery to Grade 2 will follow a 5-day week. Saturdays are holidays; however, parents may meet teachers (with prior intimation), except on the 2nd Saturday.
2. For Grades 3–7: 2nd and 4th Saturdays are holidays.
For Grades 8–12: 2nd Saturday is a holiday; 4th Saturday will be notified as required.
3. **To make birthdays meaningful, students are encouraged to contribute a book to the school library or a sapling instead of distributing sweets.**
4. **Students must bring healthy vegetarian food. Junk food and non-vegetarian items are strictly prohibited.**
5. **The Hindu in School* newspaper (Grades 3 & above) is currently subscribed by 150 students and will be renewed in July with prior intimation.
6. Introduction of **Think Edge Lab** for robotics and technology-based learning during school hours.
7. *Karate classes will be conducted twice a week after school hours (₹600/month).
8. *Hockey classes will be conducted after school hours (₹1,200/month).
9. *Guitar Classes will be held offline or online after school hours (₹1,000/month)
10. Physical Education Teachers will also train students in athletics, volleyball, kho-kho, handball, etc.
11. The Math Lab will be used to strengthen conceptual understanding through hands-on learning.
12. *Field trips will be organised to enrich students' learning experiences.
13. Grade IX students will participate in the **Kimochi Project** by the Suzuki Innovation Centre (IITH) in collaboration with Japanese high school students.
14. To reduce bag weight, selected books and materials will be kept in school from June (Class teachers will inform you about the collection of books).
15. Communication regarding homework, notes, and syllabus will be shared through the student diary; additional updates via WhatsApp.
16. **Parents are encouraged to report concerns promptly to teachers/admin without waiting for PTMs but please take prior appointments.**
17. **Parents are requested not to enter classrooms during school hours and must report to the office for any queries.**
18. Maintaining cordial relationships among all stakeholders is essential for students' development.
19. **Fee payment details will be shared by the office; parents must collect receipts after payment.**
Note: Request the parents to pay fee on time and due dates are mentioned below.

20. Vehicle parking is prohibited in front of school gates. Vehicles from outside IITH must park at the main entrance. Only group transport vehicles may proceed to the East Gate. The West Gate remains closed due to construction.
21. Regular attendance is essential. Leave must be informed in advance, and parents should ensure completion of missed work.
22. Grades 1–3 (3rd Language) will focus on basic skills without textbooks; worksheets will be provided.
23. Daily DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) time will be conducted for 20 minutes.
24. Extended hours for high school will begin from late June or early July.
- 25. Assessment Structure:**
- Term 1 (PT1, PT2, Half-Yearly): April–September
 - Term 2 (PT3, PT4, Annual): October–March
 - Continuous internal assessments will be conducted. (Please go through the learning outcomes – Link is provided below)
 - a) Grades 8 & 11: DAV Board exams (Common exam across India for all DAV School Students)
 - b) Grades 10 & 12: CBSE Board exams
 - c) Regular study and adherence to teacher instructions are essential
 - d) Nursery–UKG: Continuous assessments
 - e) Exam patterns and syllabus will be shared in advance
25. CCA and Hobby Clubs (Grades 3 & above) including Art, Eco, Cookery, Sports, Heritage and Literary are held on Saturdays.
26. Competitions will be conducted house-wise, class-wise, or individually.
27. Assembly participation is mandatory and includes various activities to build confidence.
28. Yoga sessions will be conducted twice a week.
29. Library visits will be scheduled weekly; students of Grade 5 and above may borrow books from Library.
